## Fees for Path Studies

The tuition fee for TUAS Open University of Applied Sciences is EUR 200 per semester. Therefore Path studies cost 400€ per academic year. The invoice can be paid in two instalments.

Possible cancellations (autumn 2018 studies) shall be made on **22.8.2018** at the Open UAS office by the [Cancellation form](#) . For cancellations made after that, we will charge EUR 50€ as an organising fee. **If the cancellation is done on or after 29.8.2018, we will collect the entire fee of EUR 200 per semester.**

In case you choose to cancel your path studies, or you later apply and receive a study place as a degree student, you will do so via our cancellation [form](#), also available on our website. Cancellation of your studies by informing a teacher, student office or any other member of our staff will not be accepted.

A student at Open UAS is not entitled to student financial aid, housing benefit or other student benefits. Please remember to contact TE Services prior to the enrolment, if you are registered as an unemployed job applicant with TE Services.

## Things to do before coming to Finland

### Accommodation

Before arriving to Finland, **the most important** thing is to have a place to live. Here are a couple of alternatives:

**TYS** – Turun Ylioppilaskylä, Turku Student Village <http://www.tys.fi/en>. The cheapest alternative for students. You need to provide your acceptance letter in order to apply. There are multiple choices. You can live alone or with someone else. **APPLY FOR TYS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.**

The tricky thing about TYS is that there are a lot of applicants and NOT everyone is getting a place. So here are some solutions to the problem. The following two are companies on the private market. You can apply to them as well. It is a bit more expensive, but you can always find someone else to share accommodation with. It is cheaper in that way.

## Documents

Take all documents that you have, such as:

- Passport
- School certificates (including higher education certificates you might already have)
- Other documents that can be beneficial for you because in most cases you will need them.

Student Health Care Center requires all the students who have lived / stayed in countries with **high risk of tuberculosis** for more than 3 months to return the doctor's statement of health and result of Thorax X-ray in English provided in the country where you are invited to study from. ## **Local Transportation**

From Helsinki to Turku, your easiest choice is [Onnibus](#). If you are arriving from Helsinki Vantaa airport, you could take the Express Bus to Turku. Check all options here: <https://www.matkahuolto.fi/>

You can also take the train from Vantaa airport, if you buy your ticket in advance, it will be the cheapest way to get to Turku, you will need to change once from commuter train to Intercity train, but it's not hard at all. Check the times on [VR](#) website. The fastest way is to take the train from Vantaa airport to Pasila and change there to the train to Turku. In Turku there are two main stops, the Kupittaa stop is next to our school, while the Turku railway station stop is close to the city center (keskusta).

Once you're in Turku, [Föli](#) handles all the local transportation. You can check the bus timetables on the website. A single bus ticket costs 3 €, and you can get a one week pass (25 €) before you can get your student discount seasonal card.

## **Clothes**

Yep, it gets cold in Finland in winter. You can expect ample rain in summer and heavy rain showers in spring. With all this in mind, you'll have to come prepared. Take some warm clothes and socks with you because that is the secret to surviving the winter and some of the spring weather.

## **Acquire a Laptop**

TUAS is increasingly moving towards the utilization of students' own computers. Starting next semester, a lot of used-to-be computer classrooms have been transformed into "Bring Your Own Devices" (BYOD) - classrooms to be used with students' personal laptops. Read the separate document that will help you determine what specifications you need from your laptop, or if your current one is compatible to TUAS' recommendations.

# Things to do AFTER coming to Finland!

In order to stay here, you need to get a Social Security Number (the Finnish ID number). You need this for literally everything. You must obtain it from Maistraatti (Registry Office). You need to book an appointment for this. You can get a **Social Security Number** from the city center **Aurakatu 8, 20100 Turku, 4<sup>th</sup> floor.**

**Register with the police as a resident of Turku (if you come from EU).** You need to do this within **3 months from your arrival!** You will need a Social Security Number, phone number and bank account.

**If you are arriving outside EU, you already have the Social Security Number in your residence permit, but you need to register it in Maistraatti.**

**For renewing your visa,** you need to visit the **Registry Office, in Nallikatu 8, 21200 Raisio,** the busses 6 and 7 from Kauppatori will take you there.

**Get a phone number.** You need a Social Security Number for a permanent data plan. You can still get a prepaid data plan without the Social Security Number.

**Open a bank account.** In order to open a bank account, you need a social security number. Tutors provide assistance if necessary.

**Banks in Finland:** Säästöpankki, Osuuspankki, Danske Bank, Nordea Bank

**Documents required:** Study certificate, Residence permit, Passport

When choosing your credit/debit card, please note, that you can use Visa Electron card only in EU.

**Säästöpankki:** If you are under 26 years old, you will have free access to internet banking and no monthly payments. If you are older than 26, the fee will be 4€/month for the card and 1€/month for internet banking services.

**Osuuspankki:** If you are under 26 years old, you will have free access to internet banking and no monthly payments. If you are older than 26, the fee will be 2€/month for the card and 2€/month for internet banking services.

## Student Tutors' Greetings
