Congratulations on your study place! It is our delight to welcome you to Information and Communication Technology Path studies!

Please read carefully through the following information.

1. Beginning of your studies

There is a voluntary orientation for path study students on **Wednesday 21 August 2019 at 17.00 – 18.30 o'clock in ICT-City campus (Joukahaisenkatu 3) auditorium Alpha**. ICT-City campus is located near the train station of Kupittaa. Föli busses 32, 32A, 42, 60 and 221 drive past the nearest bus stops. The orientation is held only in Finnish. Orientation will focus on beginning and progress of the studies. Please become familiar also with the Path study guide. Path study guide provides mostly the same information that is given in the orientation.

2. Things to do before coming to Finland

2.1 Accommodation

Before arriving to Finland, **the most important** thing is to have a place to live. Here are a couple of alternatives:

The following two are companies on the private market. You can always find someone else to share accommodation with. It is quite cheaper in that way.

2.2 Documents

Take all documents that you have, such as:

- Passport
- ID
- TUAS Acceptance letter
- School certificates (including higher education certificates you might already have completed)
- Other documents that can be beneficial for you because in most cases you will need them here.

If you are arriving from outside the EU, bring:

- All your health certificates or a statement from a licensed physician in English.
- Chest x-rays results in English.

The healthcare system in Finland requires these certificates to ensure that you do not suffer from any contagious respiratory diseases, such as tuberculosis, “TB”. It is better if you bring certificates or at least evidence that you didn't have an infectious disease such as smallpox or measles.

2.3 Local Transportation

From Helsinki to Turku, your easiest choice is [Onnibus](#).

If you are arriving straight from Helsinki Vantaa airport, you could take the Express Bus to Turku. Check all options here: <https://www.matkahuolto.fi/>

You can also take the train from Vantaa airport, if you buy your ticket in advance, it will be the cheapest way to get to Turku, you will need to change once from commuter train to Intercity

train, but it's not hard at all. Check the times on [VR](#) website. The fastest way is to take the train from Vantaa airport to Pasila and change there to the train to Turku. In Turku there are two main stops, the Kupittaa stop is next to our school, while the Turku railway station stop is close to the city center (keskusta).

Once you're in Turku, [Föli](#) handles all the local transportation. You can check the bus timetables on the website, so you won't get lost on your first day. A single bus ticket costs 3 €, and you can get a one-week pass (25 €) before you can get your student discount seasonal card. See more: <https://www.foli.fi/en>

2.4 Clothes

Yep, it gets cold in Finland in winter. You can expect ample rain in summer and heavy rain showers in spring. With all this in mind, you'll have to come prepared. Take some warm clothes and socks with you because that is the secret to surviving the winter and some of the spring weathers.

2.5 Acquire a Laptop

Turku University of Applied Sciences is increasingly moving towards the utilization of students' own computers. Starting next semester, a lot of used-to-be computer classrooms have been transformed into "Bring Your Own Devices" (BYOD) - classrooms to be used with students' personal laptops.

Attached with this letter is a document that will help you determine what specifications you need from your laptop, or if your current one is compatible to TUAS' recommendations.

3. Things to do AFTER coming to Finland!

3.1 Official Arrangements

In order to stay here, you need to get a Social Security Number (the Finnish ID number). You need this for literally everything. You must obtain it from Maistraatti (Registry Office) and you need to book an appointment for this. Address to registry office is: **Itsenäisyydenaukio 2, 20800 Turku (Valtion Virastotalo)**. EU-students: You **must** register first in the **Finnish Immigration Office** (address: [Nallikatu 8, 21200 Raisio](#)), before you are able to obtain the Social Security Number. After registration you will be able to get the number from Registry Office. See the registration process here: <https://migri.fi/en/eu-citizen>

If you are arriving outside EU, you already have the Social Security Number in your residence permit, but you still need to register it in Registry Office.

For renewing your visa, you need to visit the **Finnish Immigration Office**, in Nallikatu 8, 21200 Raisio.

Get a phone number. You need a Social Security Number for a permanent data plan. You can still get a prepaid data plan without the Social Security Number.

Open a bank account. In order to open a bank account, you need a social security number. Tutors provide assistance if necessary.

Banks in Finland: Säästöpankki, Osuuspankki, Danske Bank, Nordea Bank
Documents required: Study certificate, Residence permit, Passport

Säästöpankki: If you are under 27 years old, you will have free access to internet banking and no monthly payments. If you are older than 26, the fee will be 4€/month for the card and 1€/month for internet banking services.

Osuuspankki: If you are under 26 years old, you will have free access to internet banking and no monthly payments. If you are older than 26, the fee will be 2€/month for the card and 2,70€/month for internet banking services.

3.2 Fun Stuff

Parties

During the year, there are a lot of student parties and events for everyone. The student parties and events usually take place on Thursdays, because most students work over the weekend. There are many pub crawls, or scavenger hunt type events around the city. For students who do not like to drink, the parties are a fun way of meeting new people even if you don't drink alcohol. Also, there are events such as Sport Appro which is basically a pub crawl but instead of bars you go and do different sports.

Overalls

Students in Finland have a tradition of buying and wearing [student overalls](#) in parties. Students have different colors for their overalls depending on what they study. Engineers in Turku have purple overalls with yellow linings. The overalls are a great for finding people who study the same subjects as you or it's just a great way of breaking the ice by asking "What degree does your overalls color represent?"

Other fun stuff to do in Turku.

We have a lot of fun stuff to do in Turku besides studying math. All the movies screening in Turku you can find at <http://www.finnkino.fi/movies/turku> .

Turku is a relatively large city by Finnish standards so we do have a lot of activities for everyone to enjoy. If you enjoy a fancy dinner every now and then, our restaurant scene is among the best in the country. If you like different sports, we have a lot of possibilities for different sports. Also, there are many events that aren't just for students but can be really fun.

We'll try and inform you on Facebook whenever there are such events. In short: if you get bored just sitting at home there are a lot of things to do in your spare time.

Path Studies' Tuition fee

The tuition fee for TUAS Open University of Applied Sciences is 200€ per semester. Therefore Path studies cost 400€ per academic year. The invoice is paid in two instalments.

It is not possible to cancel the Path studies free of charge after accepting the study place in Studyinfo! By accepting the study place you pledge to pay the tuition fee. After enrolling the studies the study place can be cancelled free of charge only with a medical certificate.

Negative decision on benefits from TE-office does not allow to cancel Path studies free of charge. Please remember to contact TE-office prior to the enrolment, if you are registered as an unemployed job applicant.

A student at Open UAS is not entitled to Kela's student financial aid or other student benefits. Detailed information can be found from the Path study guide.

In case you choose to cancel your path studies or later receive a study place as a degree student, you will do so via cancellation form. The form is available on our website. Cancellation of your studies by informing a teacher, student office or any other member of our staff will not be accepted.
